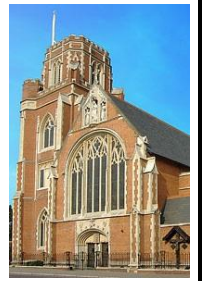

We cannot fail to be moved by today's gospel, the story of two healing and saving miracles woven together: the raising to life of a little girl who had died; and the healing of a woman who had suffered from a haemorrhage for many years. The gospel is about faith, about having faith even in the depths of grief, pain and despair. "Do not be afraid, only have faith" Jesus says to the little girl's father. Jesus says those words to us too.

The woman in the gospel and Jairus, the little girl's father, come to Christ and enter a relationship with him. That relationship is built on faith and on love. Their encounters with Christ lead them through suffering and distress to hope and to joy. We too can know that hope and joy by opening ourselves in faith to the risen Christ, especially in the most difficult times of our lives. May God give us grace to keep faith in the challenges of life, so that He may draw us from sadness to joy.

## At the British Museum

### Thomas Becket, murder and the making of a saint - Exhibition 20 May - 22 Aug 2021

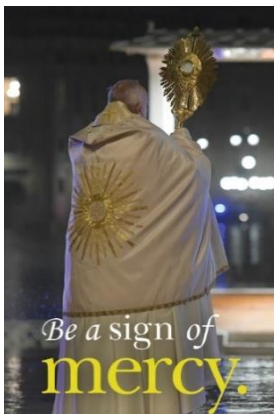
Discover the murder that shook the Middle Ages in this dramatic exhibition about the life, death and legacy of Thomas Becket.

On 29 December 1170, Becket was assassinated in Canterbury Cathedral by four knights with close ties to King Henry II, an act that left Medieval Europe reeling. Get up close to the man, the murder and the legend through an incredible array of objects associated with Becket; from illuminated manuscripts, some of which include eyewitness accounts of the murder, to jewellery and sacred reliquaries. The exhibition features objects from the British Museum collection as well as important loans from major collections across the UK and Europe, including an entire medieval stained-glass window on loan for the first time from Canterbury Cathedral.

We celebrate the great Solemnity of Ss Peter and Paul on Tuesday. It is through these two great apostles that the Church first received her faith, Peter preaching to the Jewish community and Paul to the Gentiles. Their martyrdom in Rome expresses the supremacy

of the Apostolic See and the unity of the worldwide Catholic Church under the Holy Father, the successor of St Peter.
